
## 25th Annual Mountain Sobriety Campout A FREE AA Campout &12-Step Tune Up **Bring your Sponsor & Sponsees**

Friday, August 12th, 13th, & 14th, 2022 WHEN:

You can come Thursday to set up early if you like

WHERE: Hubert K. McBee Memorial Park & Camparound

Head for Alsea Falls; about a mile past the turn off for Alsea

Falls you'll see the McBee sign(and AA Symbol) on your right

WHAT TO BRING: Tents, RVs, Camp chairs, food & water (Rustic sites)

Swimsuit, towels & floaties for the river: Musical instruments!

Bring a dish to share for the Saturday night Potluck

Bring your 3rd edition AA Big Book and 12x12

3pm to 5pm = Steps 1, 2, and 3FRIDAY:

Dinner on your own

8pm: **Topic/Discussion meeting** 

SATURDAY: 10am to 12noon = Steps 4, 5, 6, and 7

Lunch on your own

**Topic/Discussion meeting** 1pm:

3pm to 5pm = Steps 8, 9, and 10

6pm: Potluck dinner and Raffle (supports this Campout)

7pm: Speaker Meeting

SUNDAY: 8am to 9am = Steps 11 & 12


9-10am: Breakfast for All is hosted by Mountain Sobriety campout

Spiritual Speaker Meeting 10am:

Take Hwy99N from Eugene; Go through Junction City;
Take a LEFT <u>after the light</u> by the Safeway gas station to get on Hwy99W;
When you get to Monroe, go RIGHT to stay on Hwy99W;
When you get past Monroe, go LEFT on Alpine Road(across the Railroad tracks);
Go LEFT again to Stay on Alpine Road; follow the Alsea Falls signs
Go LEFT onto Glenbrook Road; Glenbrook Rd turns into Fall Creek Access Road
Continue going forward (do NOT GO LEFT again to stay on Fall Creek Access Rd)
Fall Creek Access Rd turns into S. Fork Road

You'll see this sign on your right about a mile or so after the Alsea Falls turn off

Take the exit right after this sign and continue down until you cross a bridge over the river. The road will end and you will be at the Mountain Sobriety Campout



Hubert K. McBee Memorial Park is along South Fork Rd, just about a mile west of Alsea Falls. It's a small park that allows day use as well as overnight camping.

The South fork of the Alsea River runs right through the middle of the park and the campsites are settled right up along its banks.

Our site has a huge picnic table that seats at least 50 people.

You can set up camp on either side of the road (3)
